Fort Worth Genealogical Society to to Play at White **Train Beginners**

Have you been wanting to learn how to begin your genealogical quest to uncover your past? Well the Fort Worth Genealogical Society would like to help you! On Saturday, Jan. 26, the FWGS will be offering two classes to help you begin. The first 2-hour class is at 10:30 a.m. in the Chappell Room of the Central Branch Library in downtown Fort Worth. This class will introduce the participant to some of the basics of genealogy and how to get started.

FWGS also offers a second class for their Computer Users Group (CUG) on using computerbased technology to further their genealogical skills. This second two-hour class begins at 2 p.m. on the same Saturday, in the same library. This class does require that you know some basic computer skills and have an email account. This CUG January session will debut a new curriculum for the CUG as the class will be entitled "Beginning Use of Ancestry.com." It will be held in the Intel Lab of the Central Branch Library. Participation will be limited to the number of computer stations open in the lab so plan to get there on time to sign up.

Both of the FWGS sponsored January classes are just the beginning of an eight-month series of Beginning Genealogy and CUG classes. All classes are free and open to the public interested in genealogy. You can attend one or all, but they do run in sequential order and build in depth of knowledge.

Street Improvement Detour for Roberts Cut Off

Tarrant County and the City of River Oaks started street improvements involving a new four inch asphalt overlay.

However, it comes with a price that involves a road detour for southbound traffic to Yale Street then south on Yale to Meandering Road and then back east on Meandering Rd. to Roberts Cut Off Rd.

The project could take up to 30 days to complete.

Vehicle traffic traveling on Roberts Cut Off from the north to the south on Roberts Cut Off Rd. from Skyline to Baylor will have to use a detour due to the southbound road closure for ongoing street improvements to Roberts Cut Off Rd.



Girls Lose 49-18

The Lady Lions hung tough through most of the first quarter. After Jasmine Ortiz's bucket with a little more than two minutes left in the quarter, the girls trailed by just four (4-8). But the Lady Wildcats closed the quarter on an 11-2 run to lead 19-6 as they headed into the second.


Herman Earwood, Mayor of River Oaks presented a proclamation to the Board of Education.



The final score of 77-34 was quite unexpected and should be considered an anomaly.


