Lady Lion Team Rules

The TEAM/PROGRAM comes first! Guidelines have been made to promote and incorporate this belief.

1. TRAVEL

- A. Players will ride to and from all games and tournaments with the team.
- B. In extenuating circumstances, like final exams or if on a Friday night out of town game, parents are leaving from the game to go out of town, players may leave with their parents to go out of town with them. If players are involved with band or cheerleading, they will be released to the band/cheerleading sponsors after the end of the volleyball games and will return to the high school with the band/cheerleaders.
 - a. In all cases, the player will only be released to the parent/legal guardian or the school sponsor of the later activity. At no time will the athlete be allowed to leave with a friend, sibling, aunt, etc.
- C. Players will not leave games or tournaments to eat with their parents. They will stay with the team. If a parent wants to bring their daughter food or go with the team to eat, that is permissible.

2. GAME SITUATIONS

A. Pre-game:

- a. Home games Freshman/JV players need to be in the gym ready to begin warm up at least 30 minutes prior to the first match. Varsity players will be in the gym, in the stands for the first serve of the first match.
- b. Out of town games the bus will leave when it is scheduled to do so. If a player misses the bus, they should have their parent get them to the game anyway (a player is not to drive their self to the match). She will not be allowed to start the match and will receive disciplinary action. Players have been given and will be reminded of this guideline: If you're early, you're on time. If you're on time, you're late. If you're late, you're running.
- B. Game time: Parents should remain in the stands and be supportive of their daughter and their team. They should not come down to the floor while their daughter is warming up or the game is going on. That is a major distraction.
- C. Post game: Freshman and JV teams will be expected to sit together as teams and watch the varsity match following their respective games. Varsity players will be expected to sit together as a team and watch the freshman and JV games. The team will meet immediately after the game for a short post-game meeting.
- c. The coaching staff will give parents approximate return times from out of town games. Players should be picked up in a timely manner in both out of town and home games. The coaching staff will supervise players until parents pick them up.

3. INJURIES

- A. Players should distinguish between pain and injury. Pain is soreness but with the ability to still play. Injury is pain without the ability to play. Coaches need to be informed of both pain and injury.
- B. If there is an injury to a player, the **player needs to see the athletic trainer prior** to and following each practice and game, as deemed by the athletic trainer. Failure to show up for treatment indicates the player is ready to go and is no longer injured
- C. <u>Before consulting a doctor, the athletic trainer needs to be consulted</u>. This will save players/parents time and money.

4. UNIFORMS/PRACTICE CLOTHES

- A. Players will be issued equipment. They are expected to wear it, take care of it, have it clean and ready for use each day.
- B. Practice clothes are to be worn each day in practice only. They are not to be worn home. They will be washed by school personnel each day.
- C. The day of the game, players are expected to have their uniform BEFORE they get on the bus. When preparing for "battle" players need to have all of their "armor" (uniform top/bottom, socks, ankle braces, kneepads, shoes, warm ups). Failure to do so will result in disciplinary action.

5. PHONES/IPads/COMPUTERS

- A. On out of town games, phones will be forfeited to coaches upon entering the bus. Phones will be returned to players when the bus is 15 minutes from returning to the high school
- B. During practice, phones are NOT to be brought into the gym they are to be locked up in the dressing room.
- C. Computers and IPads may be used for <u>school work</u> on out of town trips. They are not to be used for surfing the web or checking social media outlets.

6. MEDIA/SOCIAL NETWORKING SITES

- A. Do NOT post anything offensive or negative about your school, team, or teammate on Facebook or other social networking sites. Team issues need to be dealt with face to face, in the privacy of the team locker room. We will not air our "dirty laundry" for all the world to see.
- B. Coaches occasionally will/may ask to "friend" or just view player's sites to check for team issues.
- C. Refer to Castleberry Athletic Department policy for additional info, but at all times, remember you are representing Castleberry High School and your community and you should do so honorably.

7. LOCKERS

- A. Locks will be issued. Use them to protect your valuables. Lock your things up!
- B. Keep your lockers neat and orderly. The coaching staff is not your maid or your mother.

8. LOCKER ROOMS

- A. The locker room is your second homes. Respect it. <u>Keep it clean</u> and straight. Pick up after yourself. Put things away. Hang things up.
- B. Only CHS athletes are allowed in the locker rooms. It is a privilege to be a Lady Lion!
- C. Locker rooms will be **locked** during the day. Take your purses, back packs and books with you.

9. COACHING QUESTIONS

A. If a player has a question about their playing situation, they should address their respective coach. If a parent has a question about their daughter's playing situation, they should address their daughter's immediate coach. From there they can follow the chain of command: immediate coach, head coach, coordinator, athletic director, Superintendent, school board. Coaches will meet with parents during their scheduled conference times during the school day. Parents should call the school or email the coach to schedule the appointment.

- B. Coaches will only discuss the specific player. They will not discuss other players on the team.
- C. Parents/ Guardians As with all programs at CISD, the coaching staff will always communicate with you and your child on ways of improving their fundamentals & skills, but the following will not be discussed:

10. MISSED PRACTICES

- A. Players should never miss a practice unless there is a death in the family or they have a serious illness.
- B. Doctor appointments, orthodontist appointments, etc. should be scheduled at a non-practice time
- C. If a player misses a practice for a school related activity, they will still have to make up conditioning
- D. Missed practices will result in 25 playable serves, 100 passes to yourself, 100 sets to yourself, 10 down and backs.
- E. If a player has 3 unexcused practices, they are subject to removal from the team.

11. PARENT SUPPORT

- A. Parents should support their daughter's efforts. They should let her know they are behind her.
- B. Coaches do the best they can with the knowledge they have. They will always work to make your daughter better. Support them in their effort.
- C. Support the teammates of your daughter. All work hard. All want to make the team. All want to be in the starting line-up. All play a part in the success of the program. **Support** the **TEAM!**

12. PREJUDICES

- A. Coaches are prejudiced against bad attitudes and selfish players.
- B. Coaches are prejudiced <u>for players</u> who work hard every day, who encourage their teammates, who expect the best of themselves and their teammates, who never "slack", who put the TEAM ahead of themselves, who expect to win, who fight to win, who never give up, who do "right".
- C. BE PROUD OF WHO YOU ARE, WHERE YOU COME FROM, WHO YOU PLAY WITH. Be PROUD to wear that jersey, that name on your chest. BE PROUD TO BE A LADY LION.

STANDARD REQUIREMENTS FOR LETTER JACKET RECIPIENTS (GRADES 9 - 12)

When determining letter jacket recipients, sponsors will observe the following standard requirements:

- 1. The student and parent/ guardian must sign the organization's extracurricular participation agreement.
- 2. The student must be considered a participant from the first until the final date of the season.
- 3. The student must remain academically eligible from the first until the final date of the season.
- 4. The student must demonstrate an attitude of commitment while exemplifying the philosophy of the organization.
- 5. The student must be recommended by the sponsor of the organization and approved by the principal and appropriate director.
- 6. Student letter jackets will be provided by the district for approved organizations. Students will receive only one jacket with one varsity letter during their high school career. An additional symbolic award will be presented to a student who earns an additional letter(s) by the corresponding organization. Additional patches will be the financial responsibility of the student.

In addition to the above standard requirements, the sponsor may request that additional requirements be identified for his/her program.

DESCRIPTION OF AWARDS GRADES 9-12

A participant school or member school district may give an award not to exceed \$70 in value to a student during that student's high school enrollment at the same school for participation in U.I.L. interschool competition. Each year a participant school or member school district may present additional awards, not to exceed \$20 each, for participation in each additional interschool organization.

The major award (\$70) presented to a student participating in the organization in grades 9-12 is a jacket with an attached 5" letter. This award will be presented to the student in the sport in which he/ she first earns a letter. An additional symbolic award will be presented to a student who earns an additional letter/ s. The additional award shall not be given to a student for an activity during the same school year that a major award is earned, if the total award exceeds \$70.

GRADES 7-8

Parent/ Guardian Signature

A participant school may not give and a student may not accept awards for participation in interschool competition in excess of \$8 per year (total for all U.I.L. activities). A student may accept a symbolic award in recognition of his/ her achievement in an interschool contest if it is given by the organization conducting the contest (all tournament awards, ribbons, plaques, and medals).

Individual certificates of achievement will be presented to students in grades 7 and 8 for each sport in which the student participates and fulfills the Standard Requirements for Award Recipients as identified in this section.
