#### **CONSENT AGENDA**

The Board of Education voted unanimously to approve the Consent Agenda. The Consent Agenda consists of items that the Board considers routine and approves under one motion. The items approved were:

- 1. Consider Approval of Board Minutes from April 11, 2022, for a Regular Meeting.
- 2. **Consider Approval of the Master Inter-Local Agreement with Region 11 Educational Service Center.** The Master Inter-Local Agreement allows Districts to participate in purchasing services through the ESC Region 11 bidding process.
- Consider Approval of the ESC Region XI Support Services Contracts for 2022-2023. These contracts include Comprehensive Services, HR Resources, Instructional Services, OnData Suite, Library Services, PEIMS & Technology Services.
- 4. Consider Approval of Canine Team Contract with Interquest Detection Canines for 2022-2023: The district will continue to use Interquest Detection Canines for contraband detection. The contract covers nineteen half-day visits to the district. The cost is \$290.00 per visit (up \$20.00 per visit vs. the 2021-22 school year).
- 5. **Consider Approval of the Castleberry ISD Numeracy Plan:** The District Numeracy Plan outlines the district's vision, goals, instructional components, and supports to achieve academic excellence and college and career readiness standards.
- 6. **Consider Approval of the Purchase of Custodial Supplies:** Financial Services advertised RFP#22-009 for Custodial Supplies. Complete Supply was the recommended vendor.

# FINANCIAL SERVICES

DeAnne Page, Executive Director of Financial Services, gave a presentation on **Budget Workshop Session Three**, which was conducted for preliminary budget development. This was the final budget work session scheduled.

The Board of Education voted unanimously to approve the Budget Amendment. By law, the District may not exceed the budget amount within "Function" code without prior approval of the Board. The budget amendment is needed to balance functions within the funds for the end of the fiscal year.

The Board of Education voted unanimously to approve the Care Coordination Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between MHMR of Tarrant County and Castleberry ISD. This MOU enhances the coordination of care between parties to aid in information exchange, collaborative treatment planning, and care coordination activities.

The School Board reviewed the April 2022 Monthly Expenditure Report.

**Investment Report for the quarter ending March 31, 2022:** The report showed District investments by fund for the quarter ending March 31, 2022.

Board Budget Report as of March 31, 2022: The report showed Revenue and Expenditures by Fund and Function.

**Tarrant County Tax Collection Reports for March 31, 2022:** This report reflected the amount of current and delinquent taxes, penalties, and interest collected for the months and year to date.

## STUDENT SERVICES

**Capital Improvements Projects Update (2021-2022)**: The Projects Report identified work scheduled to be completed and funds expended through the 2021-2022 school year.

**Capital Improvements Projects Update (2022-2023)**: The report reflected work scheduled to be completed and funds expended through the 2022-2023 school year. This included programming, renovations, and construction projects.

Replacement Plan (2022-2023): Included items that will be purchased through the Replacement Plan for the 2022-2023 school year.

Assistant Superintendent of Student Services, Facilities & Operations Annual Report:

- Auxiliary Services Report included information on auxiliary services and activities during the 2021-2022 school year.
- Transportation Report included information on transportation services, statistics and activities during the 2021-2022 school year.
- Safety & Security Annual Report included information on safety and police department statistics during the 2021-2022 school year.
- Racial Profiling Report: A state required report that included data on all traffic or pedestrian stops. The data included the date of violation, citation/ arrest, race/ gender and if a search was conducted.
- Nursing Program Annual Report included information on nursing activities during the 2021-2022 school year.
- Department of Athletics Program Evaluation included a report on Winter and Spring sports for the 2021-2022 school year.

The Board of Education voted unanimously to approve the 2022-2023 Employee Compensation Plan: The 2022-2023 Compensation Plan included proposed increases for each pay grade, teacher hiring schedule, employee longevity pay plan, and schedule for stipend and supplemental pay.
